THE GLORY OF UKRAINE- Sacred Images from the 11th to the 19th Centuries Exhibit at the Museum of Biblical Arts 1865 Broadway (at 61st St.) NYC

Sixty icons, including one of the rarest Ukrainian icons in existence, and other objects seldom seen by the outside world are on display through Sept. 12, 2010. Featured are items from the Kyiv-Pecherskaya Lavra (Monastery of the Caves), and the Lviv National Museum. Visitors will see an 11th Century cross, chalices, liturgical objects, and textiles. The collection is said to be a unique blending of both eastern and western influences stretching back to early Byzantine roots.
