Everlasting Memories?

Someone asked Father which is correct: Everlasting memory or Everlasting memories? The answer is Everlasting Memory. (This is the English translation of the Ukrainian "Vichnaya Pamyat.") We want the memory of our loved one(s) to be everlasting with God, not just with us (since none of us is immortal – we will all die someday). God, however, IS immortal and eternal. He will exist forever. So when we sing "Everlasting Memory," we are asking God to keep the memory of our loved one(s) close to His heart, where they will last forever. So remember - we sing Everlasting Memory, not Everlasting Memories. And even though this song causes some folks to shed a tear, it really is a positive song if you think about it. If those whom we miss will last forever with God, then by our faith we live in the hope that we will be reunited again with them when God eventually calls us home to Heaven. And what a happy reunion that will be!

About "Last Rites"

In our Eastern Tradition, we do not have "Last Rites." We have ANOINTING OF THE SICK, which, when administered, gives the sick person all the benefits of Sacramental Grace, which according to God's will, provides for their physical and spiritual healing, or prepares them to complete the journey of their earthly life, whichever turns out to be God's will. When you call the priest for someone or for yourself, please don't ask for "Last Rites." That is a custom of the Roman Catholic Church, not of ours. When the priest comes to visit the sick, we do not view him as the Grim Reaper, proclaiming the advent of death. We see him instead as the one who brings hope and Christ's healing power to the sick person. No matter the outcome, the transforming grace of Christ has been given and received, and God will be with that person, whether here or in the hereafter. ANOINTING OF THE SICK – IT'S ALL ABOUT HEALING OF THE BODY AND THE SOUL!
