On January 6 we celebrate the Feast of the Theophany of our Lord according to our calendar. January 6 is also Christmas Eve on the Julian calendar. It is a wonderful opportunity to share Holy Supper with our parish family. Many of our parishioners who have emigrated from Ukraine celebrate Holy Supper on this day, the same day as their families in Ukraine.

There is no charge, but you must sign up so that we can set enough places for all. We are also asking those attending to bring a dish (enough to feed their family plus a little extra) or other item. The food will be shared. The menu should conform to traditional Ukrainian Christmas Eve type foods, whatever your family usually prepares. If you do not cook or bake, you can help with other items. The sign-up sheet is available in the church vestibule.

Хрещення Господнє (Богоявлення)

Це є третє і завершальне велике свято різдвяно-новорічного циклу яке буде святкуватися у нашому храмі 6 Січня. З ним пов'язують хрещення на Йордані Христа. Коли Ісус Христос досяг 30-річного віку, він прийняв хрещення в річці Йордан. Вийшов на берег, а з небес почувся голос Бога-Батька, який назвав Ісуса своїм Сином. І на нього зійшов Святий Дух в образі голуба. Звідси ще одна назва — Богоявлення. Православні та греко-католики вважають, що саме це свято засвідчує таїнство Святої Трійці. Адже в цей день, за християнським вченням, з'явився Бог у трьох іпостасях: Бог Отець — в голосі, Син Божий — у плоті, Дух Святий — у вигляді голуба. Вважається, що на Водохрещі, з опівночі до опівночі, вода набуває цілющих властивостей і зберігає їх протягом року, лікуючи тілесні й духовні хвороби.



Вірування: В цей день у всіх містах і селах, де є церкви, святять воду. Віддавна в народі посвячену на Водохрещі воду вважають своєрідним спасінням від багатьох недуг. Її дають пити тяжкохворим, нею освячують храми, домівки і тварин. Залишається загадкою той факт, що водохрещенська вода не псується, не має запаху і може зберігатися протягом року.

Традиції: До Водохрещі жінки намагалися не полоскати у воді білизни, бо «там чорти сидять і можуть вчепитися». Натомість дівчата у посвячену воду клали калину чи коралі і вмивалися, аби щоби були рум'яними. Загалом до Водохрещі протягом всіх свят жінки не ходили по воду, це мали робити лише чоловіки.

Напередодні Водохрещі святкується «Голодна кутя», або другий Святий Вечір. Увесь цей день віруючі люди нічого не їдять — постують. Сідають вечеряти, коли вже засяє вечірня зоря. На вечерю подають пісні страви — смажену рибу, вареники з капустою, гречані млинці на олії, кутю та узвар. Після вечері всі кладуть свої ложки в одну миску, а зверху — хлібину, «щоб хліб родився». На другий день зранку ходять до церкви святити воду.

Strength of a Man

- **How long should Liturgy be? - Is there a rule about how long Liturgy is supposed to last? My daughter gets up and leaves after an hour whether the priest is still talking or not. I say she should stay put until Liturgy is officially over. Who is right?**

Mother is always right. At least that's what my mother told me. There's no rule about how long Liturgy should last, and it's not appropriate to arrive late or leave before the final blessing. People do have to leave early if they get sick, and doctors, police officers, and fire fighters are sometimes called away. But in general, your weekend activities should be scheduled around Liturgy and people should be happy to spend at least one hour of time with their Savior and Lord.

- **How do I defend my Church? The crisis in the Church has thrown me for a loop. So many priests did such horrible things. My non-Catholic friends mock me mercilessly?**

It would be easy to find statistics that show abuses take place in all denominations and professions in the United States, but I think that would be off the point. The truth is that the Catholic Church is an easy target—some of our traditions and customs make it easy to poke fun at the Church. I would guess that priest and nun jokes far outnumber minister and pastor jokes. At times, the seeming secrecy of the Church has done us a disservice. The crisis has been a terrible moment in the Catholic Church, but I believe the Church has grown from it. I wouldn't go so far as to say the abuse has led to new life, but the Church now is much more transparent. We've learned that trust is something we need to earn and can't take for granted. So the criticism from the outside can serve the higher purpose of enabling us to reflect on who we are as Church and how we can make our Church better—not just the Church of the hierarchy, but the Church of all of us. Avoid trying to refute the criticism by pointing out problems in other religions. Simply ignore it and realize that only those without sin can cast the first stone.

 - If he decorates the church, he's wasting money.
 - If he doesn't, he's not experienced.
 - If he is young, he is not experienced.
 - If he's old, he ought to retire.
- But...if he dies...there may be NO ONE to replace him.**

Fr. Ivan's Corner

- **What is the Epiphany of our Lord?**

The Feast of the Holy Theophany (Epiphany) of our Lord is celebrated each year on January 6. The Feast commemorates the Baptism of Christ and the divine revelation of the Holy Trinity. At the Baptism of Christ, all three Persons of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—were made manifest. Thus, the name of the Feast is Epiphany, meaning manifestation, or Theophany, meaning manifestation of God.

- **Why Christmas had been celebrated on many different dates?**

The disparity in dates lies in the *different* calendars followed by each faith. The Ukrainian Catholic Church in Ukraine celebrates Christmas according to the old Julian calendar. By that calendar, set by Julius Caesar in 46 B.C., Christmas is January 7. Most of the world follows the Gregorian calendar set by Pope Gregory XIII in 1582, which sets December 25 as Christmas. The Julian calendar is the old Roman calendar, with leap years every 4 years. In the 16th century, it was noted the spring equinox was coming later and later in the year, so the Gregorian calendar was introduced. But whether Christmas is celebrated on December 25th or on January 7th the message is the same: "Peace on Earth! Good will towards men!"

- **Why does the priest bless our homes after the Feast Epiphany?**

The sanctification of the home takes place with prayer and the sprinkling of holy water, so that all creation might receive the sanctification that the River Jordan received at the time of the Baptism of Our Lord by St. John the Baptist. The priest, at this annual visit, asks God to have mercy on the house, to rid it of every evil and to fill it with every blessing. Since our homes cannot be brought to the Church, the Church, through the priest, goes to the homes of every parishioner. There the sprinkling of newly sanctified water finishes the service of blessing that began in the Parish Church.

As our souls, so also our homes become tainted by the sins of those living in them and, consequently, lose God's protective power. Every year, then, at the Feast of the Epiphany, they should be blessed again to secure for them God's blessings and protection. Just as the faithful cleanse their soul of sin at least ONCE A YEAR, and the church is blessed with the newly blessed water every year, so should the homes of the faithful be yearly blessed to invoke God's blessings and protection on it and its inhabitants. As we renew the insurance on our home every year, so we should renew our insurance of God's protection and his blessing which is of greater importance and more effective. As we welcome our priest during the holy season of Epiphany to bless our home, let us be mindful that he is bringing to us the "blessing of Jordan," and that unless God protect and bless our home, we "labor in vain." (Ps. 127:1)
