PASCHA

The English word "Easter" is not a biblical word. It is thought to be a translation of the name of the Anglo-Saxon spring goddess, "Eostre". In any case, it is an English word which is used today to translate the Greek term 'Pascha', which translates the Hebrew term for 'Passover'. The Christian Church transformed the Jewish Passover, which commemorated the freeing of the Hebrew people from Egyptian bondage, into a feast which commemorated the death and resurrection of Christ which freed humanity from the bondage of death, sin and evil. We do not have a command from Jesus to celebrate the Paschal Feast. But the Bible clearly indicates the New Testament belief that Christ is the New Pascha for believers in Him, and that this is to be celebrated by Christians: "For Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed. Let us therefore celebrate the festival ..." (1 Corinthians 5:7). Thus the celebration of Christ's Resurrection became the first Christian Feast - the Christian Pascha.

CELEBRATING OUR PASCHAL JOY

The churches of the Byzantine tradition celebrate Holy Pascha with great joy and splendor. The following are some of the Easter customs of our people which we will try to observe beginning today:

- We celebrate the Resurrection for a full 50 days until Pentecost, as if it were one great day of rejoicing.
- In our tradition, we use different Christian greetings throughout the year. From Pascha to Ascension Thursday, we use the greeting Christos Voskres - Voistynu Voskres or in English, Christ is Risen - Indeed He is Risen!
- The clergy wear only bright colored vestments even for funerals.
- Parishioners are reminded that according to ancient tradition there is no kneeling at any time from Easter to Pentecost Sunday. This is done to celebrate the joy of the Resurrection since for the Eastern Church kneeling is a sign of repentance and sorrow for our sins.

Please try to observe all these beautiful customs at home and in Church during this joyful season!

Great and Holy Lent at ACS

Every Wednesday during Lent, students in Pre-K through Grade eight participated in the Divine Liturgy and Stations of the Cross. On March 28 the Sacrament of Penance was available after these devotions. Then, on Holy Thursday, "The Living Stations of the Cross" were enacted by the 6th, 7th and 8th graders, during a whole school Spirituality Day. The school children concluded Holy Week by leading the singing of the Good Friday Vespers in English, along with Choir Boyan who sang the Ukrainian responses. At the end of this service, during the procession with the Most Holy Shroud, the girls in grades K, 1 & 2 had the privilege of portraying the angels who accompanied our Lord to His burial. Many school families and alumni attended the Good Friday Services and Veneration of the Shroud.
