Happy Mother’s Day!

Dear Parishioners,
I hope that all of our mothers have a very special day. For those of us who will be with our mothers, let’s be sure to thank God for that blessing. For those of us who due to death or distance, will not be with our mothers, let’s set aside a little time to be with them in prayer.

Our national celebration of Mother’s Day grew from the desire of many courageous women to bring forgiveness and peace to a divided nation. After the Civil War, mothers, whose sons had died on both sides, began to gather. In 1868 Ann Jarvis created a committee to establish a Mother’s Friendship Day whose purpose was “to reunite families that had been divided during the Civil War.” Later she urged the nation to have an annual memorial for mothers. Her daughter, Anna Jarvis, continued her mother’s efforts. Anna was assisted by Philadelphia merchant, John Wanamaker. In 1908 he sponsored the first “official” celebration of Mother’s Day in the auditorium of his Wanamaker store. After that, the popularity of the holiday spread quickly across the nation. On May 8, 1914, Congress designated the second Sunday in May as “Mother’s Day.” On May 9, 1914, President Wilson issued a proclamation stating that the day’s purpose was for “American citizens to show the flag in honor of those mothers whose sons had died in war.”

I’m glad that our celebration has grown to include all mothers. And I love that this special day was created by people who believed in peace. May all of us, women and men, honor our mothers by being instruments of peace and friendship in our world. God Bless!
