Christmas decorations must be removed by January 31. No shrub or tree planting is allowed. Loose stone and/or gravel are prohibited on any grave plot. Persons causing any damage to cemetery property will be liable. No dumping on the cemetery grounds or beyond the perimeter. No walking pets through the cemetery. Remember that there is no trash pick-up at our cemetery. Please take any rubbish with you and dispose of it properly at home.
