A Special Note To All Parishioners:

Please come on time for the Divine Liturgy. Realize, that when you come into the Church proper after the Great Entrance, you have missed most of the Divine Liturgy and have not really attended the prescribed service for a Sunday.

Church Etiquette: Be aware that to have attended the entire Divine Liturgy. One must receive the Final Blessing before leaving the Church Service. We also ask that you do not "visit" in the main part of the Church before, during or after the service. Please use the Vestibule or the Fellowship room to conduct your conversations - leave the Church proper (the Nave) for those that want to pray.

If you would like to become a parishioner of our parish and receive collection envelopes for 2013, please call the Rectory or talk to Fr. Ivan. Every married couple or single person 18 years old and over should be registered and receive envelopes. Your sacrifices to support our parish indicate your willingness to continue as a member of Assumption Church. <u>Ask the Pastor</u>

I have noticed over time that references to us and other Eastern Rites use the word "Church" instead of "Rite". Aren't we Catholics of the Eastern Rite?

Α: Your observation is correct. Since the promulgation of "The Decree on Eastern Catholic Churches," by the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council (more than forty years ago), more precise terminology has been employed when writing, and of speaking those non-Roman Catholics communion with each other (and with Rome). Our wholeness as a Church is expressed. "Church" allows us to be seen in the context of Christianity as a complete system of theology, spirituality, liturgy and discipline. Rite implies we are just a ritual variation of the Roman Church. This is not an accurate appraisal.

As "Church" we better exhibit the concept evident in Early Christianity; of diverse groups of people united in faith to each other in Christ not in external trappings of one particular understanding of the Mystery that is -the Church. "Rite" is still a valuable term—to refer to a particular ritual—such as the "rite" of blessing water, or a home; the "rite" of confessing sins; the "rite" or ritual of the wedding. Rather than see ourselves as a "Rite of the Catholic Church," it may be better to describe ourselves is "one of the Churches of the Church" united by inter communion with each other. Much as a Floridian and Michigander are Americans, united by certain commonality-but distinct in many areas, - are Armenians, Maronites, Byzantines-and Catholics. An Idahoan is no less an American by being from Idaho. A Ukrainian Catholic is no less a Catholic than any other Catholic by being a member of this Church and the Church. A simple change in terminology will speak well of our understanding, of the place of and relationship with all Catholics inined together in this "Confederation of Churches"
