Parish Cemetary Policy

Recently His Grace, Metropolitan-Archbishop Stefan Soroka issued a new policy and regulations regarding Archdiocesan cemeteries. This new policy applies to our parish. His Grace said, that some practices have become problematic for the appearance and maintenance of our cemeteries. Some people have installed copings in front of monuments, placed candles and planted flowers or even small trees in front of the monuments. Some plants are now major size bushes uprooting monuments. While some people provide care for these areas, more than two thirds are completely neglected. People have unjustifiably come to expect the cemetery staff to clean and maintain these areas, adding considerably to maintenance costs. Numerous complaints are received as to the appearance of the cemetery because of the unsightly appearance of the neglected areas. More important, the copings installed by people without permission expose these people and the cemetery to great risk for liability claims. Such copings are not allowed at other cemeteries.

Therefore, in order to create safe and uniform conditions, all copings (or stones, bricks or fences), plantings of any kind (including flowers) and all lamps or similar objects placed in front, behind or on the sides of monuments must be removed no later than February 1, 2014. Lamps, vases, etc. may only be placed on the base of a monument--they cannot be left on the ground. After February 1, 2014, our cemetery staff is instructed to remove any items that continue to remain in the ground and obstruct the areas around the monuments. These items will be discarded. The areas will be filled in with earth and grass planted by staff. The cemetery will then reflect the beauty and order we all expect in our cemetery. Your complete compliance with this policy will be greatly appreciated. Thank you for your anticipated understanding and acceptance.
