Taras Shevchenko Commemoration Essay Contest

To commemorate the bicentennial of the birth of Ukraine's greatest poet, Taras Shevchenko, the Assumption Catholic Church in Perth Amboy, NJ announces its 2014 Taras Shevchenko Essav Contest for all parish children and Assumption Catholic School students in grades 3-8. The "Why even today, Taras contest's theme, Shevchenko is still considered Ukraine's Greatest Hero" aims to promote learning and awareness of Shevchenko's legacy by those less or not at all familiar with his life's work. We encourage ACS students and parish children to submit their own written essay.

Ministry of Culture threatened to terminate the registration of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church because of the priests' presence on Euromaidan in Kiev (Ukraine).

Patriarch Sviatoslav Shevchuk on 13 January published and commented on the letter from the Ministry of Culture of Ukraine on the possible termination of the activities of religious their organizations based on activity on Square (Maidan Nezalezhnosti) Independence where for two months peaceful protests have been held.

On Christmas Eve, January 6, the Head of the church received an official letter from the Ministry about "systematic disregard for the law by some priests on Independence Square, allegedly supported by UGCC authorities." According to the ministry, the UGCC violated the requirements of the law on freedom of conscience and religious organizations, holding religious activities on the Maidan in December 2013 and at the beginning of 2014.

In response to this information from the Ministry of Culture, the patriarch said that the church is not taking part in political events, but it "cannot stand by when its faithful ask for spiritual care," and they are present on the Maidan. "Our Church has always been true and will remain so for the future mission that Christ the Savior entrusted, despite all the threats. We thought that the time of repression has passed, but letters like these give us doubts. We are not ashamed of our presence on the Maidan and will remain there," said the head of the UGCC. The last time the UGCC "was de-registered" was in March 1946 during Stalin's purges, and for 40 years existed illegally.
