You should remain and give thanks for His presence within you. There is no greater gift in all of creation. Holy Communion is a time for intimacy with the Lord. At least thank Him for all that He suffered on our behalf.

How would you feel if someone came to your house for dinner, then suddenly got up before dinner was over, didn't even wait for dessert, but just got up and left and didn't bother to say thank you or even goodbye? Wouldn't you consider them to be rude and ungrateful? Who left early at the Last Supper?

It's time now to break these old habits and remain until the priest gives the final blessing and closes the Royal Door. Please stay to the end and say thank you. Pray. Sing. Meditate. Be grateful for the opportunity to spend such precious time in God's presence in His house, after just having received the Body and Blood of His Son.
