**New Priest to be Ordained Today, June 22**

The Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia is happy to announce that Rev. Deacon Walter Pasicznyk will be ordained a priest on Sunday, June 22, 2014 at 3:00 p.m. in the Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Philadelphia, PA. The Most Reverend Stefan Soroka will celebrate the Divine Liturgy and with the laying on of his hands upon Rev. Deacon Pasicznyk, he will ordain him to the Order of Presbyter.

Rev. Deacon Pasicznyk, 48, is the son of Olympia and (the late) Ihor Pasicznyk of St. Anne's Parish in Warrington, Pa. He has four sisters and one brother. An additional sister died at birth. He is a graduate of Central Bucks High School East, and Pennsylvania State University with a BS in Chemistry. He had also attended Boston University where he played varsity ice hockey for two years. Rev. Deacon Pasicznyk graduated in May 2014 from the School of Theology and Religious Studies at the Catholic University of America with dual degrees of Master of Divinity and Baccalaureate in Sacred Theology.
