CHURCH ETIQUETTE

- Dress appropriately.
- Arrive a few minutes early - take a few minutes to pray and ready yourself for the Celebration of the Eucharist.
- Observe silence before Liturgy begins - people are trying to pray.
- Refrain from socializing during the Liturgy - Save your greetings and conversations for the fellowship hall. We are in the Liturgy to greet God with our prayers and worship, not to distract others.
- Please join the entire congregation by taking a seat; don't stand in front or near the confessionals, especially while Confessions are being heard.
- Refrain from reserving seats - Allow others to sit as they come into the church and especially make room for visitors so they will feel welcome
- Don't forget to bless yourself when you enter and leave the church building. Go and kiss the icon on the tetrapod (small table before the icon screen) before the Liturgy, not as you go to receive a Eucharist.
- Turn off all cell phones or any other electronic device that may disrupt the celebration.
- Please do not chew gum in church.
- Take a Liturgy book from the pew and participate at the Liturgy by singing or reciting hymns and prayers.
- It is not necessary to cross oneself when the priest is censuring the congregation. Instead, one should bow to receive the blessing.
- Only Catholics may take Communion.
- Do not cross yourself near the chalice, before or after receiving Holy Communion, as it is possible to hit the chalice with your hand.
- Take a few moments after receiving Holy Communion to express your gratitude in private prayer. What are you saying to God if you leave church as soon as you receive Holy Communion?
- Pick up bulletins or any tissues or wrappers that you may have left in the pew.
- What's the rush? Stay until the priest exits the church.
- Leaving church before dismissal deprives us of a blessing. Worship has a beginning "Blessed is the Kingdom..." and an end "Let us depart in peace..." To leave immediately after Communion is to treat the church with disrespect. The church school students and their teachers are the only permissible exception.

*Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord,
 God and Savior Jesus Christ*

The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ is celebrated each year on August 6. The feast commemorates the transfiguration or metamorphosis of Christ on Mount Tabor, when our Lord appeared in His divine glory before the Apostles Peter, James, and John.

In keeping with our Ukrainian tradition, BLESSING OF FRUIT will take place Wednesday after the 7:00PM liturgy.

Blessing of Fruit

The feast of the Transfiguration falls during that time when the fruits of the earth reach maturity. From the earliest times in the Eastern Church, on this day fruit is blessed in thanksgiving to God for the first-fruits of the earth. This custom was

adopted by the Christian Church from the Old Testament which prescribed that fruit be brought to the Temple of the Lord. In the Book of Exodus we read: "You shall carry the first-fruits of the corn of your ground to the house of the Lord your God." (23,19)
