Easter Duty

Here is the directive of our Church, regarding the obligation to receive Holy Communion, as it appears in our Metropolitan Pastoral Guidelines:

*"Every Catholic is obliged to receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Paschal [Easter] Season. The faithful of the Ukrainian Church are encouraged to receive Paschal Communion in their own Church."*

As regards Holy Confession, no one may approach to receive Holy Communion if they are in the state of mortal (serious, grave) sin. They must first go to Confession and receive absolution and penance, after which they may approach to receive Holy Communion.

Let the little children come

All children of our parish (newborn infants and older) are to be receiving Holy Communion every week at the Saturday evening or Sunday morning Divine Liturgy. Children who have not yet made their First Confession may receive without any hesitation or reservation. In the case of children who are a bit shy or bashful when they approach the chalice, Fr. Ivan suggests that their parent receive first, and then the child. What our children learn during their young and impressionable years, they will take with them into their adult lives. Let us teach them early the beneficial and life-giving habit of frequenting the Holy Mysteries (the Sacraments)!
