Liturgy Televised Live on EWTN

On Wednesday, August 5, 2015, the Divine Liturgy of St. John Chrysostom will be celebrated at the Pennsylvania Convention Center here during the 133rd Supreme Convention of the Knights of Columbus. The Divine Liturgy will be televised live on EWTN beginning at 8 a.m. Metropolitan-Archbishop Stefan Soroka, head of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia and spiritual leader of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in the United States will be the main celebrant and homilist at the Divine Liturgy. Concelebrating clergy will include over 100 cardinals, archbishops and bishops, and 125 priests and deacons. Responses to the Divine Liturgy will be sung by the choir of the Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine of the Holy Family, Washington, D.C. under the direction of co-directors Stepan Szyszka & Oksana Lassowsky.

Members of the Knights of Columbus and their families will also have an opportunity to visit the golden-domed Ukrainian Catholic Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception Monday, August 3, as part of a tour of religious sites in the Philadelphia area. It is anticipated that 3000 members of the Knights of Columbus, together with their families, from all over the world, will attend this annual gathering of this international fraternal organization in the City of Brotherly Love. Host for the convention is the Pennsylvania State Council of the Knights of Columbus.

QUESTION ABOUT OUR FAITH*Why is incense used during Liturgy?*

We may wonder why the priest or deacon censes the congregation as well as the icons. The best icon of Christ God is men and women who are made in His image. This is why the priest or deacon during the liturgy turns and censes the living icons of God in the congregation (the worshippers) after having censed the icons on the icon screen/ikonostas and walls. The usage of incense also adds a sense of solemnity and mystery to the Liturgy. The visual imagery of the smoke and the smell remind us of the transcendence of the Liturgy which links heaven with earth, and allow us to enter into the presence of God

Note: It is proper to simply bow from the waist when being censed. The sign of the cross is not necessary since a blessing is not being imparted.
