PASTOR’S CORNER:

The last wishes of Alexander the Great

While on his death bed, Alexander summoned all of his generals and told them he wanted three things upon his repose:

1. That the best doctors should carry his coffin.
2. That all the wealth he had accumulated (money, gold, precious stones, etc.) should be scattered along the processional route to the cemetery.
3. And that his hands should be let loose, so they hang outside the coffin for all to see.

One of his generals who was quite surprised by these unusual requests asked Alexander to explain. Here is what Alexander the Great had to say: “I want the best doctors to carry my coffin to demonstrate that in the face of death even the best doctors in the world have no power to heal. I want the road to be covered with all my treasures so that everybody sees that material wealth acquired on earth, will stay on earth. I want my hands to swing in the wind, so that people understand that we come to this world empty handed and we leave this world empty handed after the most precious treasure of all is exhausted, and that treasure is: TIME.”

Always remember that whatever material wealth we might accumulate in this world stays in this world. As the Prophet Job so aptly stated, “Naked I came from my mother’s womb, and naked shall I return; the Lord giveth and the Lord taketh away” (Job 1:21). Wealth does not accompany us to the grave, nor does power or glory. In death all are men are equal. Time, therefore, becomes our most precious commodity because it is limited. We can produce more wealth, but we cannot create one more minute than God allows us, and when we give someone our time, we actually give something of great value. As we prepare for the coming of this year’s Dormition Fast, contemplate how well you use your time and strive to utilize it more wisely. Give a better portion of it to your Faith (God, Church, and stewardship), family, and friends for, not only is this good time management, but the best use of our time as well. You only live once, so make the most of it!
