The Proper Reception of Holy Communion

The proper way to receive Holy Communion in a Ukrainian Catholic Church is as follows: approach the priest closely so that he does not have to reach too far, tilt your head back slightly, open your mouth wide (just like at the dentist) and do not extend your tongue. The priest should be able to drop the precious Body and Blood into your mouth from a golden spoon without touching any part of your mouth. Hands are recommended to be crossed over your breast and a sign of the cross should be made immediately before the reception of Holy Communion.
