Indiction, Beginning of the Liturgical Year

On September 1st we begin the new Ecclesiastical Church Year. It is called the beginning of the "indiction" - meaning "to impose." It was first applied in imposing taxes in Egypt. The Roman Emperor Diocletian extended the system of taxing conquered people to the whole Roman Empire. The first official worldwide indication originated with the Emperor Constantine in 312 A.D. when he saw a miraculous vision of the sign of the Cross in the sky. The Church picked this day to begin its calendar for various reasons. Before the Julian Calendar the Romans began their year on September 1st. Once the Julian Calendar was written, the year began in January and ended in December. Many years later the Gregorian Calendar took its place, because the Julian Calendar was thirteen days behind; today we use the Gregorian Calendar. According to Holy Tradition it was on September 1st that our Lord first entered the Jewish Synagogue (Luke 4) to preach his mission to us.

The Chandelier

If we look up in any Easter Catholic church we will often see a chandelier hanging from the dome or ceiling. A chandelier is a beautiful collection of lights placed in the midst of cut glass and crystal. Together they sparkle with great beauty. They remind us of the glorious beauty of the heavens with the sun, the moon, the planets, and the countless stars. The chandelier reminds us that the heavens speak to us. They tell us of the greatness of God. If the stars came out only once every one thousand years, we would stay up all night to see them. We would never forget what we saw. But they come out every night to remind us of God's presence. We should not take them for granted. They tell of God's greatness. They show forth His glory. Someone once called the moon "God's night light." Every time we see the chandelier, it reminds us of how great God is. He is the One who placed all those beautiful stars in the heavens. He is the One who guides them. He is also the One who loves and guides us when we place our lives in His hands. O Lord, how manifold are Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou made them all (Psalm 1 04:24).

Using Your Potential

The story is told of two men who were caught stealing sheep. Their punishment was to be branded on the forehead, "ST" (sheep thief). One of the branded men, unable to deal with his brand, immediately moved to another area to live. The one who stayed in the locality decided that he would show his townsfolk that he could change.

As the story is told, many years later a newcomer in town, seeing the branded man, asked another person, "What does ST mean?" "I don't know," he replied, "but knowing the man I think it stands for 'SAINT'."

We are called not to be afraid of small beginnings, but also not to fail to begin. What we have done, or what we have let ourselves become is of little concern to the Lord. What we decide to do with our God-given potential is the only concern. We have the potential, however small we may perceive it to be, to call to life the power of God's Holy Spirit within our lives; that His light and life may shine through our words and actions.
