**TODAY: 19th Sunday After Pentecost**

The gospel reading of this Sunday starts with what is generally known as "the golden rule of Christianity: " *And just as you want men to do to you, you also do to them likewise.*" Our Lord Jesus Christ came into the world not only "to fulfill the Law" of the Old Testament but also to bring it to a new level, based not on revenge but on sacrificial love, which became the "new Law" the Law of the New Testament. In the Sermon on the Mount, which this gospel reading is a part of, Christ explains how the New Law is different from the Old Law. He explains how "an eye for an eye" from the old Law becomes "turn the other cheek" and "love your enemies" in the new Law. Those who embrace the New Law become part of a new people, a new nation, a new Israel, guided not by the Law of Moses but by the new Law proclaimed by Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

**Light a Candle of Remembrance.**

The Ukrainian World Congress together with other organizations has launched an international action "Light a candle of remembrance!" to mark the 85th anniversary of the genocide of the Ukrainian people, the Holodomor. For 85 days before the International Holodomor Memorial Day on November 24, 2018, a candle will be lit daily in a different part of the world uniting Ukrainians and friends of Ukraine in remembrance of the innocent victims of the genocidal policy of the Stalin regime, while raising awareness of the issues of human rights, respect and tolerance. Assumption Parish and School on October 5, 2018 will "Light a Candle of Remembrance" and participate at the 8:45 a.m. Divine Liturgy in remembrance of the victims of the terrible tragedy in the history of the Ukrainian people - the Holodomor - the Genocide of 1932-1933.
