# Today: Sunday of the Prodigal Son

The Sunday after the Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee is the Sunday of the Prodigal Son. This parable of God's forgiveness calls us to "come to ourselves" as did the prodigal son, to see ourselves as being "in a far country" far from the Father's house, and to make the journey of return to God. We are given every assurance by the Master that our heavenly Father will receive us with joy and gladness. We must only "arise and go," confessing our self-inflicted and sinful separation from that "home" where we truly belong (Luke 15:11-24).

# Why do we light candles in our Church?

We Christians don't just pray with our lips. We pray with all of our senses, sight, hearing, touch, smell, taste, to even include that sixth and often neglected sense, the nous which is sometimes called the eye of the soul. Candles are just one small part of that. Upon entering the church it is customary to light candles and offer prayers for one's personal needs or that of a family member or friend. Candles are lit before icons as a sign of one's faith and hope in God's help that is always sent to all who turn to Him and His Saints with faith and prayers. In practice, when lighting a candle in Church the faithful usually make a small offering to the Church. By lighting a candle and offering a prayer, one enters into closer contact with the Church and her ministry to the faithful, invisibly warming the soul by the visible light of the candle.

# What does "prodigal" mean?

The word "prodigal" is mysterious to us. Almost the only time we ever hear it is in the title of this parable. It's basic meaning is "wasteful"--particularly with regard to money. It comes from Latin roots that mean "forth" (pro-) and "to drive" (agere). It indicates the quality of a person who drives forth his money--who wastes it by spending with reckless abandon. That's what the prodigal son does in this story

# How often do you recharge your mobile phone?

How often do you recharge your mobile phone? Some need to do this once every three days, while others need to recharge their batteries daily. Then there are those who don't have mobile phones, so recharging does not apply to them. Let us look at this from a different angle. Doesn't the need to recharge a phone battery remind you of the need to recharge yourself? This is a valid comparison. Quite often, it seems that a person's battery is low, and he or she needs to find a source of energy and recharge. This "boost" provides the strength to go on. Our Lord is the source of renewal for each of us. He is our true source of inspiration and strength. He is always ready to help and strengthen us spiritually: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11, 28). Such a recharging is far more important than the recharging of a mobile phone. So why do we so often forget about this? Why are we not concerned that our battery is critically low, and why We go on the are we not looking for a charger? internet, we play games on our mobile phones, we listen to music and do other things which are basically not important or pressing at the given moment. The same goes for our internal state. We are spiritually exhausted, yet we continue to do that which exhausts us even more. On the surface it may seem that we are full of energy, yet this is not always a good indicator of what is happening on the inside. A mobile phone looks exactly the same on the outside, whether it's charged or not. When we click the on button, the phone lights up and we can see how much life the battery has remaining. It's much the same with us: when we feel an emptiness inside, we turn to God and HE gives us the light that opens our eyes. May each of you have a light in your heart that indicates when your battery is running low and needs recharging. May you always draw strength and inspiration from being with God, and may your battery always be 100% charged.
