Where is the beauty of the Cross?

It is in the holiness of Jesus, who died that the Kingdom of God - life, love, mercy, wisdom - might be established in the world. We are called to "take up the cross," which means uniting ourselves with Christ in love that the truth and wisdom and the glory of God might shine forth. Today, therefore, St. Paul writes, "I have been crucified with Christ; yet I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me" (Galatians 2:19-20).

Lapsed Members - Give them a call. See how they are doing. Let them know that you not only miss them but also care enough to see if everything is okay. A kind word can go a long way. <u>Baptisms</u> - Two God-parents are required, at least one of whom must be Catholic by faith (and the other a practicing Christian). Parents/grandparents/guardians must also promise to bring the child up in the Catholic Christian way of life.

Ask the Pastor

Why does the Church celebrate the Assumption-Dormition (i.e., literally death) of the Mother of God? Why are the days of memory of the saints the days of their death? Why do we celebrate death like this?

Christian attitude to death is the attitude to a defeated enemy. On the one hand, death is what sin introduced into the world; God did not create death. Death is contrary to our true nature. In the words of a church hymn, "I weep and lament when I think of death, and see lying in the graves, our beauty created in the image of God, disfigured and without glory, having no shape or form." (8th hymn of St. John Damascus in the Funeral Service) However, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ endured death on the Cross and defeated it. Today, it is the gateway to eternal and blessed life for faithful Christians. The Church declares that the saints who have gone to God do not forget us. Rather, by God's will, they mysteriously participate in the work of our salvation, like older brothers in a good family who take care of the younger children at the behest of the Father. This is particularly true for the Mother of God. The Church sings, "In your Dormition you did not forsake the world, O Theotokos." Not only are we certain of the blessed fate of the Mother of God, but also of the fact that her death was as painless as falling asleep and that she, as a caring Mother, constantly remembers and prays for us ever since her Dormition.
