Property Insurance Due in March,

Our parish recently paid property insurance for our church and school buildings in the amount of \$32,670.00. This biggest expense of our parish was paid to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia.

School Sharing Lunches.

The ACS Class of 2020 in Perth Amboy, NJ had a short lesson in history and social awareness when they helped prepare 100 lunches alongside our friends from Perth Amboy Catholic, the University of Notre Dame NJ Alumni Group, and NJ Troopers. The program is called "Sharing Lunches". It benefits the Hogar Crea Treatment Center and the Center for Support and Success, both right here in Perth Amboy. They experienced first hand the assembly line way of working. While they assembled sandwiches and filled the "Sharing Lunches" lunch bags, the class discussed what it must have been like to work doing the same job for 12 hours a day at the turn of the 20th Century. Students also talked about the value of helping those in our community that may be in need of extra support. We are called to serve God by serving others; so, today the Class of 2020 worked together to hopefully make someone's day just a little easier and happier. During this season of Lent what better way to give of ourselves then to do work of charity!

The Third Sunday of Lent.

This is Sunday of the Veneration of the Holy Cross. The cross stands in the midst of the church in the middle of the lenten season not merely to remind men of Christ's redemption and to keep before them the goal of their efforts, but also to be venerated as that reality by which man must live to be saved. "He who does not take up his cross and follow me is not worthy of me" (Mt 10:38). For in the Cross of Christ Crucified lies both "the power of God and the wisdom of God" for those being saved (1 Cor 1:24). The Cross is brought in a solemn procession from the sanctuary and placed in the center of the Church, where it remains for the whole week. Please venerate the cross with a simple bow and NOT a kiss.

Taking precautions as coronavirus continues to spread.

Our parish is taking extra measures to maintain a healthy house of God in response to the coronavirus. This past Monday and Thursday, five ladies cleaned down the upstairs of the church with bleach-based products. The church pews, walls/panels, doorknobs, flat surfaces of doors, restrooms were also clean by our janitor. We have gone through extensive measures to make sure we do our due diligence in sanitizing the whole place and to provide a clean, safe environment for people to worship together.

Pray with Pope Francis the entrustment to Our Lady in the time of pandemic

One of the prayers Pope Francis asked for this month is the most ancient Marian prayer Our Lady under this title is also known as "She who saves the City," a designation given her in 1944, when a vast crowd followed Pope Pius XII to the image of the Virgin, praying before the fresco for the protection of Rome during the final battle for the city, which led to its liberation from German occupation. A few days after the Allied entry into the city, Pius XII gave the image the title Salvatrice dell'Urbe. Here is Pope Francis' prayer of entrustment, concluding with the most ancient recorded prayer to Our Lady:

O Mary, you shine continuously along our journey as a sign of salvation and hope. We entrust ourselves to you, Health of the Sick, who at the Cross were near to the pain of Jesus, keeping your faith firm. You, Salvation of the Roman people, know what we need, and we trust that you will provide for those needs so that, as at Cana of Galilee, joy and celebration may return after this moment of trial. Help us, Mother of Divine Love, to conform ourselves to the will of the Father and to do what Jesus tells us, He who took our sufferings upon Himself, and took up our sorrows to bring us, through the Cross, to the joy of the Resurrection. Amen.

We seek refuge under your protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our pleas - we who are put to the test - and deliver us from every danger, $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{O}}$ glorious and blessed Virgin.
