## TODAY:Sunday of the Paralytic.

How tragic is the story of the life of the paralytic. A man had been paralyzed for years. He lay at a short distance from healing, but he himself had no strength to merge into the waters of cleansing. And no one - no one in the course of all the thirty eight years and more - had compassion on him. Everyone who was sick rushed to be first in order to be healed. Others, who were attached to those suffering by love, by friendship, helped them to be healed first. But no one cast a glance at this man, who for years had longed for healing and was not in himself able to find strength to become whole. Jesus came by and spotted this man. The paralytic didn't recognize Jesus as the Messiah...but he was willing to follow directions, and as a result received the healing he had hoped for after so many years of waiting. When we recognize that our hope is in Christ alone, we know that only He has power in our lives.

## How the Virgin Mary protects her faithful children from all evil.

The Virgin Mary is first of all a mother, and a very powerful spiritual mother! She is fully united with her Son in Heaven and seeks to use all of her power to protect her children, who are invited to turn to her in their time of need. St. Louis de Montfort, an 18thcentury priest who dedicated his whole life to leading souls to Jesus through Mary, wrote about the protection she offers in his book entitled True Devotion to Mary. He compares her to a hen who gathers her brood under her wings, saving them from outside enemies.

Mary, the beloved Mother of chosen souls, shelters them under her protecting wings as a hen does her chicks. She speaks to them, coming down to their level and accommodating herself to all their weaknesses. To ensure their safety from the hawk and vulture, she becomes their escort, surrounding them as an army in battle array. This she does out of the pure love she has for us, especially those who are daily devoted to her. This simple truth has been confirmed by many throughout the years, especially exorcists.

Famed exorcist <u>Fr. Gabriele Amorth</u> discovered this reality in his dialogues with the devil, where the devil said to him, "I am more afraid when you say the Madonna's name, because I am more humiliated by being beaten by a simple creature, than by Him."

Pope Francis related similar words in a <u>homily at St.</u> <u>Mary Major</u>, "Where the Madonna is at home the devil does not enter; where there is the Mother, disturbance does not prevail, fear does not win."

Let us stay underneath the wings of the Blessed Mother and let her safely guide us to eternal life!
