The Theophany of Our Lord.

About the beginning of our Lord's thirtieth year, John the Forerunner, who was some six months older than Our Savior according to the flesh, and had lived in the wilderness since his childhood, received a command from God and came into the parts of the Jordan, preaching the baptism of repentance unto the remission of sins. Then our Savior also came from Galilee to the Jordan, and sought and received baptism though He was the Master and John was but a servant. Whereupon, there came to pass those marvelous deeds, great and beyond nature: the Heavens were opened, the Spirit descended in the form of a dove upon Him that was being baptized and the voice was heard from the Heavens hearing witness that this was the beloved Son of God, now baptized as a man. It is also from this that the present feast is called "Theophany," that is, the divine manifestation, God's appearance among men. On this venerable day the sacred mystery of Christian baptism was inaugurated; henceforth also began the saving preaching of the Kingdom of the Heavens.

Holy Water blessed on the Feast of the Theophany of Our Lord will be available in small bottles at the front of our Church. This year, I ask that you please don't bring your own containers as you won't be able to fill them on your own due to covid 19 restrictions.

Two traditional greetings for Theophany:

One greeting is "Christ is baptized" and the response "Glorify Him!" Another greeting starts the same way "Christ is baptized" but responds with "In the Jordan river!" Both are very recent (the first in the last 150 years) although the second seemed to appear even more recently in the last 50-60 years.

House Blessings.

One of the holy traditions of the Ukrainian Catholic Church is the Home Blessing Service, which was established by Our Savior Jesus Christ, when after His Resurrection He entered the upper room and blessed the disciples. When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." (John. 20:19). During the apostolic times, the twelve apostles of Jesus visited the homes of the faithful to bless them and to spread the good news of Christ's birth and His Resurrection. Likewise their followers - priests and bishops, entered the homes of the faithful on the occasions of Theophany to tell the good news of our Lord's Nativity and to bless them and their homes through a special Service.

- It is with great regret due to Covid-19 pandemic Fr. Ivan won't have in-person house blessings for our parishioners this year.
- Small bottles of holy water will be available for anyone to take home at the front of the church.
- Those parishioners who built or purchased their house and who wish to have it blessed are asked to call Fr. Ivan 202-368-2408, and schedule a house blessing after current COVID-19 restrictions are lifted.
