With the start of the New Year, we would like to begin a new ministry in our parish: SPF50. This ministry is adopted for our use from different dioceses and SPF stands for "Scripture, Prayer, Family" and is designed to equip individuals and families to read the Scriptures and pray together at home.

Why "50"? I was told that on average, if a family uses the recommended Bible readings and prayers, they will spend approximately 50 minutes per month in these spiritual exercises.
