Candles

Upon entering our church, it is customary to light candles and offer prayers for one's personal needs, or that of a family member or friend. Candles are lit before icons as a sign of one's faith and hope in God's help that is always sent to all that turn to Him and all His Saints with faith and prayers. Candles symbolize what is known as the Light of God or the Light of Christ.

Sunday of the Samaritan Woman

For two thousand years, the Church, the well of the New Testament, has been springing forth the living water, the word of God and the grace of the Holy Spirit, meant to quench the thirst of the souls of those who desire to be in communion with God through the Church established by the incarnate Christ. The dialogue between Christ and the Samaritan woman at Jacob's well is an indication of how God reveals Himself to people. The Son of God initiates the dialogue with the Samaritan woman with a simple request "Give Me a drink."

Once she is engaged in dialogue, slowly, slowly He reveals Himself to her; first, as the one who possesses the living water; then as the one who knows her secrets: "You have well said, 'I have no husband,' for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly;" Having captured her total attention, He reveals to her His true identity: The woman said to Him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When He comes, He will tell us all things."

Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am He." When God reveals Himself to us, a restructuring of priorities takes place in our lives. The woman abandons her daily routine and becomes an apostle: The woman then left her waterpot, went her way into the city, and said to the men, "Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did. Could this be the Christ?" May the risen Lord continue to give us the living water!

Ascension

The feast of the Ascension, May 13, commemorates the ascending of Christ into heaven witnessed by His Apostles. It took place on the Mount of Olives the fortieth day after the Resurrection. It marks the triumphant close of the post-Resurrection period during which Christ repeatedly appeared to His Disciples and spoke to them of 'the things concerning the kingdom of God'. Thus, Christ's human nature was taken into Heaven, wherefrom 'He now exercises all power in Heaven and on earth'. The Ascension is one of the principal feasts of the Christian year irrespective of denominations. It falls on the 6th Thursday after the day of Easter. St. John Chrysostom gives indisputable evidence of its celebration in the later years of the 4th century.

SCHOOL NEWS: Small school with a big heart!

Over 55 years ago when Assumption school opens its door, a chalkboard was a classroom staple, but now chalkboards and dry erase boards have been replaced with nine Promethean boards. Promethean boards and other new devices are now in all classrooms of Assumption Catholic School in Perth Amboy, NJ as part of more than \$70 thousand dollars in new technology, funded mostly through the CARES Act grant funds. With our continuing focus on Technology, our teachers anticipate using them to support student learning and engagement across the curriculum in a variety of ways. Since September, through the efforts of the principal and many dedicated people, we were able to purchase cleaning supplies to help prevent spread of COVID-19, new chromebooks with carts, robots and science equipment for the new STEM room and science lab and many other great things that will enhance and enrich the learning experiences for our students.
