PASTOR'S CORNER

Dearly Beloved Faithful in the Lord,

In today's Holy Gospel reading, we hear of the miraculous healing of a demon-possessed boy.

His father begged the Lord to have mercy on his son and to heal him. The Lord replied, "O Faithless and perverse generation! How much longer must I be with you?" The father tried to blame the disciples as they could not heal his son. WE, as God's people, should not try to blame others for our own ineptness in managing our spiritual lives and in maintaining our faith. Some of us even go so far as to say "I prayed in front of the miracle working icon but my family member is still sick. I went on a pilgrimage to Jerusalem but I did not get a job yet or get a promotion." Why didn't God answer my prayers? Has God foresaken me?"

In truth, it is usually that we do not have enough faith so that our prayers can be heard. We may pray without sincerity! We may go through the motions of prayer but not really believe that God can perform miracles in the modern world, in our life. This is sad. I recall the words of the Apostle St. Paul who taught that "Christ is the same today, yesterday and unto ages of ages." This is precisely why we must all pray. In doing so, the Lord gives us faith. We must self-reflect and open our hearts to the Lord and be like the man in the Gospel reading and say with our whole heart, "I believe, Lord, help my disbelief!" It is by such a prayer with great sincerity that we call upon the most Merciful Lord, God, and Savior Jesus Christ. In our hearts, we recognize that the Church always offers us new hope. The Church offers us a new start from the very beginning. Let us follow this example, and begin to have the awe-inspiring faith that will allow us to be in Communion with our Lord. Have a faith that is so inspiring that, even as much as the grain of a mustard seed can move the mountain of disbelief before us! In His service, prayerfully yours, Fr. Ivan.

Questions and Answers about Our Faith

At the Transfiguration, the apostles seemed to know that the persons conversing with Jesus were Moses and Elijah. How?

The Gospels do not explain how the disciples were able to recognize Moses and Elijah at the Transfiguration, so any answer is a guess. Possible ways the disciples were able to recognize Moses and Elijah:

Jesus referred to them by name in his conversation with them, and the disciples overheard it.

The disciples overheard the conversation, and the context informed them with whom Jesus was speaking.

They had something unique about their appearance that made them readily recognizable (Exodus 34:29; 2 Kings 1:8).

There was some sort of heavenly announcement that wasn't recorded in the Gospels.

Jesus explained to the disciples who they were.

They were divinely inspired to recognize them, similar to God's revelation to Peter that Jesus is the messiah.

Is the penitent bound by the seal of confession? No, a penitent is not bound by the seal of confession. One

should be prudent when discussing one's sins, but it's possible another person might benefit from the advice a penitent received in confession. A priest who celebrates the sacrament or anyone who deliberately or inadvertently hears a confession is bound to uphold the seal (Code of Canon Law, can. 983).

In addition, while a priest may not break the seal, if a penitent brings up the same subject outside of priest could confession, then the prudently about that conversation. But the seal remains even after a penitent's death.
