COME HOME FOR CHRISTMAS! We all know family members, friends, neighbors, coworkers, or school friends, who are Catholic and no longer attend the Divine Liturgy. Christmas is a great time to invite them to come home to the Church. Think about it, pray about it, and invite someone to come to Church with you during the Christmas Season. There is always a chance that you will be rejected or your invitation will fall on deaf ears. Just remember that Jesus experienced the same kind of reception and He did not give up. So if your invitation receives no response or a negative one, just wait a few weeks and ask again. In the meantime, pray for that person, but don't give up on them no matter how long it takes. It is hard to persevere and it is hard to be rejected, but just be patient and kind and trust in the Lord.

# Today's Sunday: HOLY FOREFATHERS & MOTHERS

The Church rejoices in the festival of the Holy Forefathers and Mothers of the Old Covenant, including those who came before the giving of the Law; they foretold the coming of the Messiah and are redeemed by his saving Pascha...The holy forefathers and mothers, together with all their descendants, have chosen life. They find it in God's Messiah, Jesus Christ, who is Life itself, God's incarnate Word. The celebration of the 'Winter Pascha' is a celebration of Life in God's Word. For "Christ who is our life" has already appeared (Colossians 3: 4). We have "beheld His glory" (John 1: 14). Now that glory is hidden in the "form of a slave" (Philippians 2: 7), but it will be revealed at the end of the ages in power for those who "have loved His appearing" (2 Timothy 4: 8).

#### "IT'S OKAY TO SAY MERRY CHRISTMAS"

Every Christmas, anti-Christian groups such as the American Civil Liberties Union, the American Communist Party, various Islamic groups and Atheist groups sue some city for erecting a nativity scene on public property. Likewise, fearing they may be perceived as politically incorrect, a handful of retailers (like Target and others) replace the word "Christmas" with "Holiday" in their marketing. It may seem like a small issue, but these things are significant because they diminish the importance of the Christian foundations of our society. Our ideas of justice, mercy, liberty and love for our fellow man are deeply rooted in the Traditions of the Apostolic Church which includes the Bible, particularly in the life, death and resurrection of Our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ. That's why America has been a light among the nations in the world. Like the angel who appeared to the shepherds saying: "I bring you good news of great joy," we Christians have a story to tell about the blessings of honoring the true God. Telling the story can start with simply not patronizing stores that use "Happy Holidays" instead of "Merry Christmas" and by reminding those who say "Happy Holidays" that "It's okay to say Merry Christmas."
