January 6: Epiphany/Theophany (Baptism of Our Lord)
Te Feast of the Theophany ("manifestation as God") of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ celebrates that, when our Lord was baptized in the Jordan, the Holy Spirit descended upon him and the Father proclaimed that Jesus was his Only-Begotten Son. Though in America it is overshadowed by Christmas, the Theophany is at least as important to us as Christians. As part of the feast, we have the Great Blessing of Water, which recalls all the ways God has worked salvation through water, culminating in the Lord's baptism-which points to his descent into death and rising on the third day.

Reminder: There is NO FASTING between Christmas and Theophany! Faithful are obliged to fast ONLY on the Eve of the Theophany on Jan. 5th.
