#### Pastor's Report on Delivering Aid to Ukraine

The war in Ukraine looms larger and larger every day. The U.N. migration agency said that nearly 6.5 million people have been displaced inside Ukraine, on top of the 3.2 million who have already fled the country. That means that around a quarter of Ukraine's 44 million people have been forced from their homes. Those are numbers that are hard for us to wrap our brains around! As of today, almost 1,000 people have died. This does not include Russian soldiers who have died during the conflict. It is hard to hang onto hope when we hear the reports and see the pictures of suffering Ukrainians, especially children. And yet, that is what we are called upon to do, especially in anticipation of Pascha Feast.

Today, I would like to give you a second report of what our parish have done so far with the donations of medical supplies, as well as monetary donations that we received for the people of Ukraine.

- \$5,000 were wired to the Bishop Hryhoriy Komar, an Auxiliary bishop of Sambir- Drohobych Eparchy, to provide lifesaving aid to those in need in Ukraine. Bishop already sent pictures of what was purchased and delivered to Easter Ukraine, Kharkiv.
- Helped, Anna Maria US (\$500) and Collegium Musicum (\$550) with shipping of items that will be assembled to Medical Rescue Kits and delivered to paramedics "Hospitallers" directly to the fields and hospitals in Ukraine.
- This week (713 lb) of medical supplies were sent to Bishop Bohdan Manyshyn, an Auxiliary Bishop of Stryj Eparchy and the Head of the Council on Pastoral Care in Crises and (470 lb) of medical supplies were sent to Ivano-Frankivsk hospital. It cost us \$2,366 to ship two palets of supplies.
- Thanks to Meest-America who shipped over 50 boxes of our humanitarian aid packages for Ukraine at a discounted price

Thank you to our many parishioners and friends who so generously contributed to the to the Humanitarian Aid Fund for Ukraine. Your generosity speaks of the faith we share, for "What we do for the least of our brethren, we do for Him."
