Please note:

- **KNEELING** resumes on Sunday of Pentecost. There was no kneeling for the 50 days from Pascha to Pentecost because of the celebration of the resurrection. Kneeling is a sign of penitence - humility before God.
- **FOR COMMUNION**, make sure you open your mouth wide so the priest may more easily avoid touching your mouth, tongue or lips. Communion spoons are sanitized by placing in 85% alcohol
- **PLEASE DO NOT LEAVE BULLETINS IN THE PEWS OR PLACE AT THE BACK OF THE CHURCH** - please take any printing home where you can read and then you can dispose at your home

Unless we know someone is a practicing Catholic, delays and hard feelings can result when people want to be married, when they want their child to be baptized, when they want to be a Godparent or a Confirmation sponsor, when they want to enroll their child in Religious Education, to provide you with a record of your contributions for tax purposes or to obtain a favorable "support tuition rate" at Assumption Catholic school. It is simple to establish and maintain a record of attendance at the Divine Liturgy and parish support, but filling out a registration form alone does NOT accomplish this, USING YOUR NUMBERED ENVELOPES ON SUNDAY does. TODAY: Sunday of All Saints.

The first Sunday after the Feast of Holy Pentecost is observed by the Ukrainian Catholic Church as the Sunday of All Saints. This day is designated as a commemoration of all of the Saints, all the Righteous, the Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors, Shepherds, Teachers, and Holy Monastics, both men and women alike, known and unknown, who have been added to the choirs of the Saints and shall be added, from the time of Adam until the end of the world, who have been perfected in piety and have glorified God by their holy lives. Since many Saints are unknown, and their number has increased with time, and will continue to increase until the end of time, the Church has appointed that once a year a common commemoration be made of all the Saints.

Assumption Catholic School was proud to present our 53rd graduating Eighth Grade class.

Nineteen strong, smart, funny, kind, helpful teenagers prayed together last Saturday morning with their teachers and families joining them at the Divine Liturgy. Apostles Fast, June 13 - June 28.

The period from the day after All Saints Sunday (June 12 is All Saints this year) to the day before the feast of Sts. Peter and Paul on June 29 is an optional fasting period. During this Penitential Season in our Church, we ARE ENCOURAGED to abstain from meat or other types of food more than the normal mandatory Fridays. As one of the four penitential seasons of our Church, it is a time when the faithful are encouraged to celebrate the Mystery of Holy Confession. This is a great time to grow closer to God as did Sts. Peter and Paul who were leaders in the commission of Christ to baptize all nations and evangelize them.
