Questions About Our Faith

What do these words mean: "antiphon," "troparion," "kontakion," and "prokeimenon?"

These are all hymns. An antiphon is a collection of Scripture verses, usually from the Psalms. A troparion is a brief hymn expressing the main focus of that day's celebration. A kontakion is similar to a troparion, except that it expresses the history of the celebration. Each day of the Orthodox calendar has at least one troparion and kontakion. A prokeimenon is a passage of Scripture that introduces the theme of the Epistle reading to follow. These are the Eastern Christian counterparts to the psalms (antiphons), hymns (troparia), collect-hymns (kontakia), and graduals (prokeimena) still found in some Western Christian liturgies.
