The Pre-Lenten Sundays: The Prodigal Son.

We hear on this third pre-Lenten Sunday the Parable of the Prodigal Son [Luke 15:11-32]. The younger son asks for his inheritance even while his father is still alive. It is as if to suggest that his father is more useful dead than alive. The story develops quickly by a series of powerful emotional images. The younger son is soon deflated as he encounters hunger, deprivation and loneliness. His father is eager to welcome him home upon his return, running out to meet him. The older son remains outside the celebration for his brother, paralyzed by anger, resentment and envy. This parable of God's forgiveness calls us to "come to ourselves" as did the prodigal son, to see ourselves as being "in a far country" far from the Father's house, and to make the journey of return to God. We are given every assurance by the Master that our heavenly Father will receive us with joy and gladness. We must only "arise and go," confessing our self-inflicted and sinful separation from that "home" where we truly belong.

Blessing Candles on the Feast of the Presentation.

In the Church, the Holy Day of the Meeting of the Lord (Striteniye) is celebrated on February 2, forty days after Jesus' birth. It is customary on this feastday to bless candles. These blessed candles are used in the church and at the Holy Supper on Christmas Eve, at the blessing of the home, in the room of the sick or dying, at Pascha, etc. They are sometimes called "thunder" or "hromnitza" candles and are lighted during storms and lightning. The lighting of candles is a must in the Ukrainian Catholic Church. No service can be held without them. Next time you are in church, light a candle for a special intention. It is a centuries and centuries old tradition.

Fraud Alert - Fraud Alert -Covid-19 Vaccine Scams.

With the distribution of vaccines for COVID-19 now underway, it is important to be aware of scams seeking to take advantage of the elderly and other vulnerable people. Seniors should be particularly vigilant for callers, texters, or visitors seeking money or their private information in order to receive the vaccine. The United States Department of Health and Human Services issued these tips to protect yourself from fraud.

- You will NOT be asked for money to improve your ranking for vaccine eligibility.
- Government and State officials will NOT call you to obtain personal information in order to receive the vaccine, and you will NOT be solicited door to door to receive the vaccine.
- Medicare will NOT contact you to offer you COVID-19 related products.
- Do NOT respond to or open any text messages or hyperlinks from unknown senders.
- Be suspicious of any unexpected calls or visitors offering vaccinations, tests or supplies.
