TODAY: 8th Sunday After Pentecost.

I have always wondered about how Jesus responds to the disciples in today's Gospel when they report that there is not enough for the enormous crowd to eat. They advise the Lord to send the people away to forage for themselves. However, Jesus instructs His disciples to feed the crowd. His disciples immediately protested.

They said: "We only have two fish and five loaves of bread! This small amount of food will never be enough for this huge crowd!" Jesus, however, was not disturbed or worried. He told His disciples to bring the fish and the bread to Him. Then He instructed the crowd of people to sit down on the grass.

I wonder what the disciples were thinking as they gathered the food? Did they think Jesus was crazy? Or were they anticipating another miracle? Jesus took the bread and the fish and He blessed them. He then gave the bread and fish to His disciples and instructed them to distribute the food to the people. They did so. And as we know, everyone was well fed and there were quite a few baskets of leftovers.

Do you ever get concerned that you may not have "enough" for what seems to be needed? It may not be enough money, energy, time, love, or _ fill in the blank). These are the times when we need to come to Jesus and ask Him to supply us with what we truly need. And Jesus will give us what we need. However, it may not be exactly what we asked for. At these times, will we trust that Jesus is supplying us with "the loaves and fishes" that we need? Or will we complain because Jesus had disappointed us.
