Its repetitive nature gives way to reflecting on what Christ's life was like as you meditate on each mystery.

Let not even one day pass without saying it, no matter how burdened you may be with many cares and labors." - Pope Pius XI

CHURCH TRADITIONS & ETIQUETTE:

Modern culture is rather casual in its approach to worship and sacred space. In our Ukrainian Catholic Church we adhere to long-standing traditions that express the reverence which is due to God, to each other, and to ourselves. Respect for God and His house translates to respect for all of His creation. The following guidelines are customs and traditions of etiquette that we need to be aware of as Catholic faithful. Please read the following information prayerfully and with an understanding for the Church's obligation to shepherd with love and compassion for all the faithful.

WHEN YOU ENTER CHURCH, it is customary to first go to the Tetrapod Table up front, in the middle of church - we are to make the sign of the cross, bow, and kiss the icon displayed there (we are excused of kissing the cross and/or icons at this time due to the pandemic). We then bow and make the sign of the cross again, and then go to light candles or take our place for Liturgy. In our Ukrainian Greco-Catholic Churches, we make the Sign of the Cross (holding together the right thumb, index and middle fingers) starting with our forehead, then to our mid-chest, then to our right shoulder first, then the left shoulder. Also in our churches, we do not genuflect (brief bending of the right knee towards the altar) - instead we make the sign of the cross the Eastern way, and bow towards the altar. And remember that church is a holy place, so try to keep quiet (not to talk or laugh loudly) before, during, or after the church services.

<u>Arrive on Time</u> - The time to arrive at church is before the service starts. If you arrive after the Divine Liturgy has begun, try to enter the church quietly and at the appropriate moment. We must not be walking in or around the church when the Gospel is being read, when a procession is taking place, or at any time that the priest is facing the congregation. Fast before the Liturgy. It is a Church law that one fasts for at least 1 hour before receiving Holy Communion. Water and medicine can be consumed, of course. The purpose is to help us prepare to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. Please be quiet while in church. Once you enter the church - it is not the time or place to visit with those around you. If you must talk - do so as quietly and briefly as possible. Remember that your conversation might be disturbing someone who is in prayer, which is much more important. Sssshhhh

Last Sunday, after the Liturgy for the Feast of the Patronage of the Most Holy Mother of God (Pokrova), the meeting with the older youth of our parish took place in the monastery of the sisters Servants of the Lord and the Virgin of Matara. The sisters started with the topic of the meaning of life, its value, the criteria for choices in life in order to be able to live, not exist, and not go with the flow. During the break, everyone actively participated in the prepared quiz, in which the boys' team won!

In a friendly atmosphere, with pizza and Coca-Cola, various questions that concern today's youth arose. The meeting ended with a joint prayer to the Mother of Protection in the chapel of the monastery.
