We are happy that you have joined us for worship today and hope that you will join us for Coffee Hour after Sunday 9:00 am Liturgy. Please note that reception of the Holy Eucharist is only for baptized members of the Catholic Church who have prepared with prayer, fasting, and periodic confession.

TODAY: Zacchaeus Sunday.

The paschal season of the Church is preceded by the season of Great Lent, which is also preceded by its own liturgical preparation. The first sign of the approach of Great Lent comes five Sundays before its beginning. On this Sunday the Gospel reading is about Zacchaeus the tax-collector. It tells how Christ brought salvation to the sinful man, and how his life was changed simply because he "sought to see who Jesus was" (Luke 19:3). The desire and effort to see Jesus begins the entire movement through Lent towards Pascha. It is the first movement of salvation. Our lenten journey begins with a recognition of our own sinfulness, just as Zacchaeus recognized his. He promised to make restitution by giving half of his wealth to the poor, and by paying to those he had falsely accused four times as much as they had. Questions to Ponder:

*Put yourself in the Gospel scene. Who am I? Zaccheus? One of the people who wanted to see Jesus? Who murmured against Jesus? Who wants to Harm Jesus?

*Once you decide which you are ask the question, WHY

On the feast day of Theophany, following the Divine Liturgy, the Great Blessing of the water took place at our parish. At the luncheon, after all expenses, almost six thousand dollars were raised for humanitarian aid and medical treatment of Ukrainians injured in the war. It was a great event of Our Lord's Baptism Solidarity and a day of Prayers for Ukraine. At the conclusion of the celebration, all tired volunteers' and faithful heard in their hearts the Lord's voice, "You are my beloved sons and daughters, in you I am well pleased"
