Questions About Our Faith. Did You Know ???

• Father, isn't the Eucharistic celebration in our parish called Mass? I have often heard you call it Divine Liturgy. Which is correct?

The word Mass is used by the Latin (Roman) Catholics as the name for their Eucharistic celebration. It is derived from the Latin phrase used at the end of that service, Ite, missa, est, which literally mean, "Go, it is the dismissal." The phrase has in its intention that the participants of that Eucharistic celebration go forth into the world as the Body of Christ and continue the mission of the Saviour. Most Eastern Christian Churches, including our own Ukrainian Catholic Church, call the Eucharistic celebration the Divine Liturgy. This English phrase is derived from the Greek or Slavonic phrase, Sluzhba Bozha, which means "The work/service of God." It is our service/worship of God and His good work among us. The correct term to use for the Eucharist celebration is The Divine Liturgy. Let's use the proper name for the worship of God.
