DID YOU KNOW? Questions about Our Faith.

Under Pope Pius IX, Peter's Pence collection was started. How did the Vatican get its earthly treasures? The Vatican could resolve the hungry and poor issue with these treasures they have stored. How much are they giving to these people? Jesus told us to take care of these people.

These are some good questions. But in order to answer them I have to address the claim that the Vatican could resolve the hunger and poverty issues with their "treasures." I have found that there are many common misunderstandings about the Catholic Church especially regarding money. One misunderstanding that I often encounter is the perception that the Catholic Church is a monolithic corporation, like Google or Ashley Furniture. Financially speaking, the Catholic Church is a bunch (hundreds of thousands?) of non-profit organizations with various degrees of affiliation to one another. For example, there is some financial connection between our parish and the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, but there is not really any financial connection between our parish and a Catholic parish in Cameroon, a country in Central Africa or the Archdiocese of Lviv, Ukraine. Catholic parishes throughout the world have a loose and indirect financial connection to the Pope, the Vatican, or the Holy See. Remember, there are various types of assets, such as cash, property, and investments. Our parish, for example, has all three. The purpose of these assets is to further the mission of the Church. Whether it is our parish or the Vatican, all of these assets ultimately originated from free will donations.
