DURING THE PASCHAL SEASON:

This period of great festivity and joy finds its liturgical expression in the following manner:

- ▲ Easter Greeting we great each other with the Paschal salutation, "Christ is risen! Indeed He is risen!" for 40 days, until Ascension Day.
- ▲ No Kneeling Please remember that here is NO kneeling during the entire Easter Season. Kneeling has been our position of prayer during the Holy Season of the Great Fast (Lent) as the expression of our humility and our repentance.
- ▲ The Paschal Troparion "Christ is risen from the dead" is sung or said at the beginning or end of all prayers until the Eve of Ascension.

Question About Our Faith.

What type of body did Jesus have when he rose from the dead?

Jesus rose from the dead with a body that was the same as before, but it had additional qualities that were not there during his earthly life. That real body possesses the new properties of a glorious body: not limited by space and time but able to be present how and when he wills; for Christ's humanity can no longer be confined to earth, and belongs henceforth only to the Father's divine realm.

For this reason too the risen Jesus enjoys the sovereign freedom of appearing as he wishes: in the guise of a gardener or in other forms familiar to his disciples, precisely to awaken their faith.
