The Cemetery is a Holy Place

As we prepare for Memorial Day, which is where we civilly observe the blessing of graves, it is worth the time to reflect on the significance of the cemetery in our faith lives. Most people find cemeteries as morbid places, but people of faith should not find them so as they hold the relics/earthly remains of those faithful who have gone before us.

The cemetery is a holy place because it houses the bodies of our forefathers and foremothers who are resting in peace until the Last Judgment. On the crosses and monuments are inscriptions, or messages, that testify to our Love for those who have already left this world. Although the cemetery is a place of sorrow where we may even shed tears, it is also a place of hope and prayer because it reminds us of our Lord's Resurrection, His triumph over death.

Where better to think of our own earthly end and our future life than in the cemetery? All of us will die one day. We are not on earth for centuries, but for a few decades, and sometimes even less than decades. The cemetery reminds us to prepare ourselves for God's righteous judgment. After we die our bodies will lie here until they are raised again at Christ's Second Coming. If we have been faithful Christians, our souls will go to be with the Lord, beyond the grave, awaiting the Final Judgment.

In the cemetery, it is good to pray for the reposed (those who have already died.) Here, our prayers for them are especially alive and fervent. Those who have reposed need nothing more from us than our prayers.
