Reception of the Communion in Our Church.

According to the regulations of the Catholic Church, only baptized Catholics (of any Eastern Rite Catholic Church or Roman Catholic Church) who are not in a state of mortal sin could approach for the Holy Communion. For those who are divorced and living common-law the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist cannot be received. In the Byzantine Rite, Holy Communion is given under both species. While approaching the priest during the Sacrament of the Eucharist remain standing, lean your head back and open wide your mouth, without extending your tongue. The priest will use a spoon to retrieve the Holy Communion from the chalice and will drop it into your mouth without touching you with the spoon. Please do not close your lips upon the spoon. Swallow the Holy Communion and return to your pew. Engage in silent prayer until all other communicants have received Communion.
