### Welcome!

Our warmest greetings are extended once again to all visitors and guests who are participating in Divine Liturgy. It is always a joy to have you praying with us.

Our Pastor, Fr. Ivan Turyk is on vacation August 8-22. Thus weekend Liturgies and the Liturgy for the Feast of Dormition are celebrated by the Vicar general and chancellor of the Ukrainian Catholic Archeparchy of Philadelphia Msgr Peter Waslo, who recently was elevated to the rank of Mitred Archpriest.

### The Feast of Assumption (Dormition of Theotokos)

The Falling-asleep of the Theotokos sometimes also called the Assumption - is celebrated on the fifteenth of August, preceded by a two-week fast.

Holy Tradition tells us that the Apostles except Thomas were transported mystically to Jerusalem in order to be with the Blessed Mother as she died, and also to be present for her burial. When the Apostle Thomas arrived the next day, the tomb was opened so that he could make his farewell. To their astonishment they found an empty tomb filled with sweet-smelling flowers and fragrances. This event is not found in Sacred Scripture but is accounted for by Holy Tradition. Therefore, we bless sweet-smelling flowers in remembrance of this great sign of Mary's holiness and her being taken body and soul to heaven.

 In our parish, the Feast of the Dormition will be commemorated on Wednesday, August 14 with an evening Divine Liturgy at 6:30 p.m. and on Thursday, August 15, with morning Divine Liturgy at 9:00 p.m. Remember that this is a Holy Day of Obligation.

### Blessing of Flowers.

In the Byzantine Church we bless flowers on this festival, not simply because they were found in the tomb of the Virgin Mary, but because they are the seeds of next year's plantings. What we see in any bloom now is the seed of another one to come, and therefore a strong symbol of resurrection. Besides seeds, we also bless herbs on this day. The prayers speak of all these things, flowers, herbs and seeds, as medicine. There is a healing that comes from death, as contradictory as that might sound. St. Gregory of Nyssa once referred to death as "the final remedy." Things which cannot be set right in this world can be made right in the next. So don't forget to bring a vase or bouquet of flowers for blessing.
