Pastor's Corner

The pilgrimage to Rome for the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope was a deeply spiritual and unforgettable journey. One of the most moving moments was a powerful encounter with Pope Leo XIV at St. Peter's Basilica, where he delivered a message of hope to Ukrainian pilgrims amidst the ongoing war. It was a profound honor for me to pray for all our parishioners and to receive the Holy Eucharist at the altar built over the tomb of Saint Peter, located beneath the main altar of the Vatican Basilica.

The following day, we celebrated another beautiful liturgy at St. Sophia Cathedral, where two young altar servers from our parish, Nicholas Derevenskiy and Andriy Hrud, had the privilege of participating in the service.

Our pilgrimage also included visits to the four Papal Basilicas and the Holy Stairs, offering moments of deep prayer, reflection, and penance. We visited several Marian shrines and paid our respects at the tomb of Pope Francis – each stop enriching our spiritual experience.

The journey concluded with awe-inspiring visits to the Vatican Museums, Sistine Chapel, Spanish Steps, and the Pantheon — each place offering a deeper connection to our faith and the timeless beauty of the Eternal City.
